UNDER THE SUN



FULL DESCRIPTION

Shot with the permission and supervision of North Korean authorities—a collaboration they would come to regret —Under the Sun turns a propaganda effort into a deep-cover documentary about life inside one of the world's most repressive nations. Russian director Vitaly Mansky was guided to preapproved locations in Pyongyang and provided with model subjects: young Lee Zin-mi, a student at the city's best school, and her parents, workers at two exemplary factories (or so officials claimed). The film follows Zin-mi as she studies the triumphs of Great Leader Kim Il-sung, joins the Children's Union and participates in the national celebration of Kim Jongil's birthday. Each sequence is rigorously scripted for maximum ideological correctness, but Mansky shows the cracks in the façade: schoolchildren struggle to stay awake during lectures, adults' carefully composed expressions flicker with exhaustion and anxiety and even the resolutely compliant Zin-mi eventually crumbles under pressure. By keeping the camera rolling while ever-present minders exhort the citizenperformers to play themselves "more joyfully," Mansky reveals the grinding gears of the totalitarian message machine. "I wanted to make a film about the real Korea," he said, but what he found instead was "the myth of a real life." — Juliet Clark
